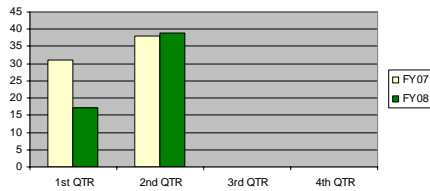
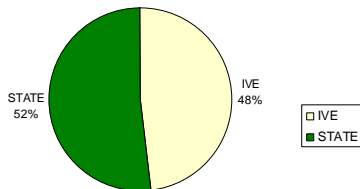


FY08 COMPARISON OF EVENTS HELD



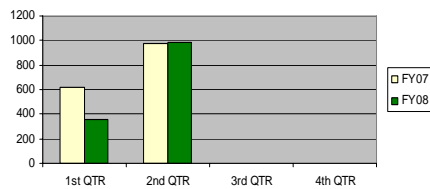

DJJ Academy Practicum:

6 Hours-Undergraduate Credit
8-Week Course Offering

As DJJ academy trainees near graduation, they can apply for admission at EKU and register for the online applied skills practicum course. Online classes are offered in the spring, summer and fall terms and the only prerequisite is completion of a DJJ academy. The course offers students the opportunity to share their personal academy experience as well as provide a self-evaluation of how they are applying the curriculum learned in their work settings. Practicum students submit weekly journal entries that describe work experiences and how they handle specific situations including identification of academy training skills that were applicable.

The College of Justice & Safety, Correctional and Juvenile Justice Studies (CJS) allows DJJ academy graduates to enroll in the applied skills practicum course through a scholarship award. To receive the scholarship, students must reside in the state of Kentucky and receive a passing grade in the course.
