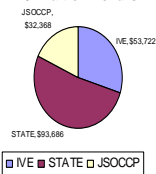


**Tuition Assistance Review**

In 2006-07 DJJ provided \$147,408 in general tuition assistance to agency employees. Sixty-one DJJ staff completed over 351 hours of undergraduate college credit and 193 of graduate coursework. Forty were from youth development centers, regional juvenile detention centers, treatment centers and central office staff. Twenty-one staff were from IVE facilities and community programs. Fourteen DJJ staff completed the Juvenile Sex Offender Certification Course Program (JSOCCP), held at the University of Louisville. Each JSOCCP participant earned six-hours of graduate college credit.

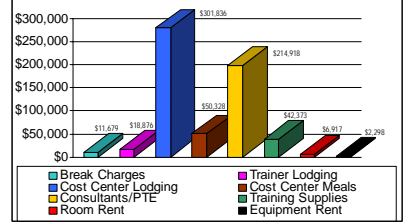

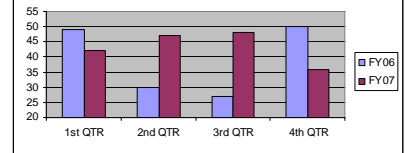
## FY07 TRAINING EVENTS BY REGION



## FY07 Expense Summary

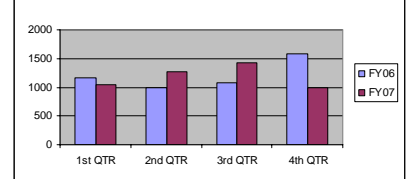


## FY06-07 Comparison of Number of Events Held



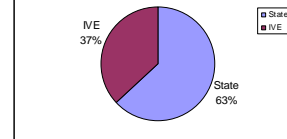
