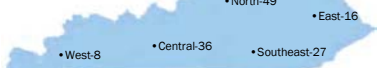

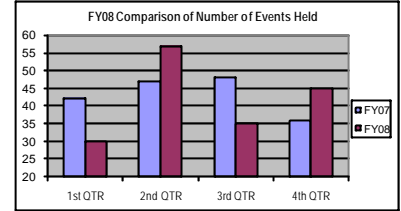
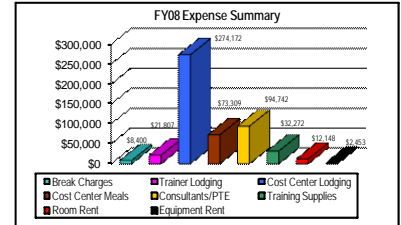

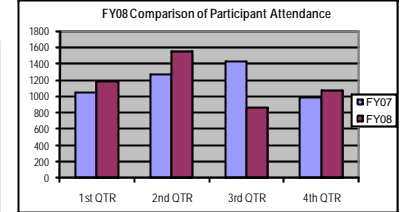
FY08 TRAINING EVENTS BY REGION
