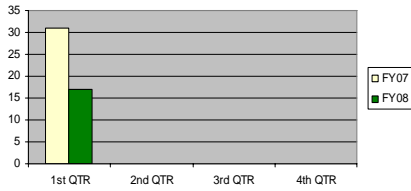
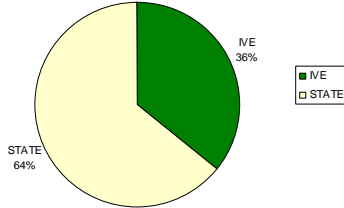


FY08 COMPARISON OF EVENTS HELD



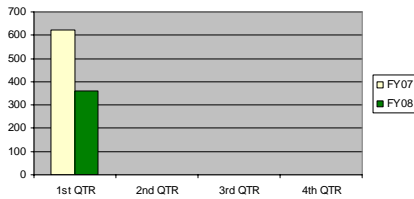

DJJ WELCOMES CAMPBELL AND MCKEEHAN TO TRAINING STAFF



William A. Campbell brings 14 years of experience in working with at-risk youth. Originally from Chicago, William attended Western Illinois University in 1981. He enlisted in the Army in 1985 and served eight years training soldiers. William received an honorable discharge after serving a tour in "Desert Storm."

After leaving the 101st Airborne Division at Ft. Campbell, William began his career in 1993 at FHC, Cumberland Hall Acute care psychiatric hospital.
